

Saint John Mary Vianney (Cure of Ars) Feast day: August 4

Saint John Mary Vianney was born at Dardilly, France, in 1786. He was a farm hand until he began his studies for the priesthood at age 19. His talents were poor, and his progress slow, but his desire to serve the Church as a holy priest and his knowledge of Church teachings carried him through to ordination in Genoble in 1815. He became the parish priest of Ars in 1818, the little town where he labored until his holy death on August 4, 1859.

His work entirely renewed the little parish. Continually engaged for many hours daily in hearing confessions and giving spiritual direction, it is said he could see into people's minds and know the future. Because of this gift he converted many sinners and helped people make good choices. Pilgrims descended on Ars to hear him preach. He introduced the frequent worthy reception of Holy Communion, organized prayer groups, and inspired a tender devotion to the Blessed Virgin.

Saint John Vianney felt it the duty of a pastor to expiate the sins of his flock, so he spent hours in prayer, in mortifications and fasting for his flock. He was assailed by Satan and patiently endured all that was given him.

It is no wonder he is honored as the patron of Confessors and priests. He was beatified by Pope St. Pius X, who himself had served as a parish priest. In 1925 he was canonized by Pope Pius XI.
