He obtained his doctorate in 1983 from the Gregorian University, has taught at 2 seminaries, assisted in formation work for 12 years, and served 2 terms as provincial in his own community. He's a respected author, teacher, and lecturer. Father's warmth and style of speaking is for people of all states in life and levels of formation. This one-day boost will provide guidance for when we struggle to overcome the greatest obstacle in the "everyday" and spiritual life - discouragement.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I want to take this opportunity to update you on activities happening in the parish during these summer months.

We have begun to have a regular schedule of Masses both on Sundays and during the week. (The Saturday vigil Mass at 4:30 pm has also resumed.) It's good to be together again and to be able to participate in the wonderful sacrifice of the Mass.

We encourage parishioners, who are comfortable, to join with us in worship, although the dispensation for attending Sunday Mass still continues at this time. If you do join us for worship, please remember social distancing and hand cleansing. The wearing of face masks in church is now mandated by order of Governor Evers. There are masks available at the entrances to church in case you did not bring your own.

Over the course of the summer, we have been able to celebrate a number of sacraments here at Blessed Sacrament. Our young people have been Confirmed, and have received Holy Communion. Although the format is a little different during these days, the grace, blessings, and power of the sacraments remains. We are most pleased to be able to join with these young people in their life of faith, and I encourage you to pray for them regularly.

Moreover, our buildings and grounds activities have continued throughout the summer. In fact, we have completed or are starting a number of projects, including the following:

- We have installed additional handicapped openers on the side entrance of the church as well as in the parish center restrooms.
- Sometime in the near future, we will begin construction on a wheelchair access ramp located on the alley side of the church. This will give parishioners easier access to the narthex and the church itself.

The church remains open daily, from 6:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., for private prayer. Please stop in and offer a prayer for yourself, or for your brothers and sisters, as well as the many needs and issues facing our community and nation. Although the office remains open on a limited basis (9:00 am – 1:00 pm weekdays) please feel free to contact us for needs that you may have.

We continue to send regular emails to all of our parish members. If you are not receiving emails from the parish, please contact the office, and let us know what email address we need to have for you.

As your pastor, I truly miss seeing each and every one of you. Please know that I remember you all regularly in prayer. I have realized that during these days, although I do pray privately for you as your pastor, I too need my people. The pastor doesn't exist without the sheep. So, not only people need priests, but also, priests need people. We need each other.

Please always remember that I remain available for spiritual needs that you may have during these difficult days. Please contact the office, and I will be happy to assist you in any way possible.
