

Regulations on Fasting and Abstinence (from the Chancery Bulletin, Diocese of La Crosse)

- 1. Catholics who have celebrated their 14th birthday are to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, all the Fridays of Lent, and Good Friday.
- 2. In addition to abstaining from meat, Catholics who have celebrated their 18th birthday, until their 59th birthday, are to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Those who are bound to this regulation may eat only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.
