Blessed Father Michael J. McGivney Founder of the Knights of Columbus Beatified on October 31, 2020

+++++++++++++++++

Since its founding, the Knights of Columbus have been rooted in the principles of Charity, Unity, Fraternity, and Patriotism. The Knights of Columbus serve to protect the sanctity of Life in all stages. It helps to build up the Family, making men better husbands and fathers, and protecting families from catastrophic events.

We are all so familiar with the work of the Knights in our parish and our community. These dedicated men spend time in prayer, as well as pitching in when helping hands are needed.

Their Founder, Blessed Father McGivney taught this by example in the 1800's. He was born to Irish immigrants in Waterbury, Connecticut, in 1852, and, like many children of his era, went to work in the spoon-making department of a local factory to help make ends meet for his family. However, he generously answered God's call to the priesthood, and he was ordained in 1877.

His pastoral assignments took him from classroom and pulpit to jail, and further into the streets where tension was rampant among the working class families he served. Early on he recognized the value of having a Catholic, fraternal benefit group dedicated to strengthening the religious faith of its members and at the same time addressing the financial needs of families overwhelmed by illness or death of the breadwinner. So the Knights of Columbus was established and grew by leaps and bounds.

At his funeral in 1890 – he was only 38 – delegations from 57 K of C Councils attended along with 70 of Connecticut's priests and many civic leaders. Today 1.7 million members work through 14,000 fraternal councils in 13 countries.
