LECTIO: EUCHARIST

This fantastic prayer/discussion/learning program will be offered here at our parish on Tuesdays, 8:15-9:45 am, and at many other parishes and times throughout the week. It is a 10-week series and begins on January 28.

Q: Who forgot to take down the Christmas trees in church?

A: No one forgot. They are still here this weekend because the Christmas Season ends with the Baptism of Our Lord, which we commemorate at Masses this weekend.

Our Liturgical Seasons teach us so much about the importance of what we encounter here at Mass. The Season of Advent, when each week another candle was lit on the wreath, making our space brighter and lighter, flew by during December. In fact, that lone rose candle which was lit on the third Sunday pointed us directly to the celebration of Christ's birth among us, the Light of the World blazing into the darkness of man's faltering existence. The penitential violet color of the season of Advent was put aside as the angels - and we among them here on earth sang "Glory in the Highest" on Christmas. All celebration began, and our liturgical color is now white. The remembrance of the Holy Family, of Mary as the Mother of God, and of the manifestation of Jesus to the world at His Epiphany are a heaping platter of joy passed around the Table of the Lord during the Christmas season. Now today His baptism. Though, of course, following the events of His birth by 30 years, Mother Church reminds us that Jesus didn't come once 'way back then ONLY. His coming is a daily, and a minute-to-minute occurrence in our lives, if we but ask. Our own Baptism opens that door, allowing His graces to touch every corner of our lives. His humble acceptance of the baptism by John in the Jordan is our playbook, too. In humility we have knelt at the Manger and looked at the little King who came among us as one of us. Can we continue to ask in humility that He enters our hearts each day and nourishes and guides us to be His disciples?

Coming soon: 7 weeks of Ordinary Time before Lent to work on this.

One last time: Merry Christmas, Christians.
