

PRESENTATION OF THE LORD January 2

This Feast, which we will celebrate on Tuesday this week, was first observed in the Eastern Church as "The Encounter," no doubt because of the appearance of the Prophetess Anne and the sage Simeon in the Temple as Mary and Joseph took their 40-day-old son Jesus to present Him to the Lord. In the sixth century, it began to be observed in the West: in Rome with a more penitential character and in Gaul with solemn blessings and processions with candles, hence it's name "Candlemas Day." It was also known as the Feast of the Purification of Our Lady, as Mary would have followed the Mosaic Law in going to the Temple at this time for the rite of purification following birth. In 1969 the Church officially renamed the feast the Presentation of the Lord; it marks the official closing of the Christmas Season. (information from CatholicCulture.org)

The Gospel for this day is so full of material for mediation. Read it: Luke 2: 22-40

*Mary and Joseph take Jesus to the Temple in accord with the Law they lived by: "Every first-born male shall be consecrated to the Lord."

*They came as a poor couple bringing the meager offering of turtledoves and pigeons.

*Simeon, it says, was a good man who was waiting for the Savior when he went to the Temple. Upon seeing the Holy Family, he was inspired by the Holy Spirit calling Jesus the Light that is revealed to believers and unbelievers alike. (The Light of the World) He further addressed Mary as one who would suffer, offering us the path to take our cares to her.

*Then there's 84-year-old Anna the Prophetess, one of those unique persons God plants in our world. She lived in the temple, offered her prayer and fasting daily. Isn't it amazing to think how God provided her with the inspiration to proclaim that this 40-day-old Baby would provide the means of **our redemption!** Perhaps our own prayer could open our eyes so fully.

*Mary and Joseph left this awe-struck encounter to **live simply** in Nazareth as the Savior grew "in size and strength, filled with wisdom. And the grace of God was upon Him."
