

Father Raj is in India with his family. His mother has been very ill. Keep them all in your prayers.

Oh! Oh!

Just when Father Raj leaves town, we discovered a huge plumbing problem in the school building. The drain line from the kitchen is broken and unable to be repaired, so replacement is the only option. When a building of over 80 years faces this kind of repair, you know it will be extensive and expensive. First, the asbestos which was used back then needs to be cleared. To access the line, the floor of the lower level will need to be dug up, and things cannot get underway until August. So, when you see all that work being done, say a little prayer all goes smoothly.

SPIRITUAL ADOPTION

Babies in the womb need our prayers. The Social Justice Committee is sponsoring a campaign promoting the spiritual adoption of a preborn baby. This doesn't have to be someone you know personally; it could be any baby from around the world. For nine months you agree to pray for a baby every day, praying for a healthy delivery for the baby and the baby's mother. We have refrigerator magnets and prayer card available in the Narthex. There is even a space for you to give the baby a name. A good time to pray would be with the family after supper or before bedtime, but any time of day would be great.
