

BOOK OF REMEMBRANCE

During the month of November you are invited to write the names of your loved ones who have died in the Book of Remembrance in front of the pulpit. They will be remembered at Masses during this, the month of the Faithful departed.

VETERANS DAY Monday, November 11

This legal holiday is dedicated to American veterans of all wars. On Nov 11, 1918, on the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month, an armistice was declared between the Allied nations and Germany ending World War I, then known as "the Great War." It became a federal holiday in 1938, and, following the Korean Conflict and World War II became known as Veterans Day, rather than its original title of Armistice Day. When it was first commemorated and for many years to follow it was common that business and school activities paused briefly at 11:00 am in honor of all veterans.

In 1971 the observance was moved to the 4th Monday in October to ensure a 3-day weekend for federal employees. However, in 1978 it was returned to November 11 because of the significance of this date historically.

Canada, Australia, and many countries in Europe commemorate veterans at this time of year, as well. It is well to remember that this day pays tribute to all American veterans – living and dead – but especially gives thanks to living veterans who served our country honorably during war or peacetime.

And isn't it wonderful that on November 11 we Catholics celebrate the Feast of Saint Martin of Tours, a soldier-turned-priest whose selfless life brought him to sainthood.
