THANKSGIVING IN THE NEW WORLD

In 1621, after only one-third of the Pilgrims of Plymouth had survived the severe New England winter, the Wampanoag Indians under Chief Massasoit taught the settlers how to plant corn. As a result, they were blessed with a bountiful harvest. A great celebration ensued, supplied primarily by Wampanoag gifts of turkeys, ducks, geese, and several deer. Two years later when Massasoit fell ill, the Pilgrim families helped nurse him back to health.

Over a century later, while American General George Washington was camping at Valley Forge, he got down on his knees in the snow to pray for help. When he saw God answer his prayer by sending military assistance from France, Washington called for a day of thanksgiving among his troops.

Later still in 1789 President Washington proclaimed the first National Day of Thanksgiving as a "day of public thanksgiving and prayer" in gratitude to God for allowing this new nation to establish a form of government so conducive to their safety and happiness."

The Day of Thanksgiving continued through the presidencies of Washington and John Adams. However, when Thomas Jefferson opposed such a day, the national observance fell into disuse until Abraham Lincoln reactivated it in 1863.

THANKSGIVING AND THE EUCHARIST

Jesus Himself offers us a model of gratitude to God for all the gifts that God has bestowed on us. He models an attitude of thankfulness and praise both in His prayers and in His actions by accepting whatever comes from God – even suffering – trusting that God has given it out of loving care and not anger.

It is with this sense of thanksgiving that we should come to every Eucharist. Indeed, if we have participated fully in the Eucharist and understood the grace it offers us, then the attitude of thanksgiving will permeate our whole lives. We will find ourselves becoming ever more aware and ever more grateful for all the good things God gives us every day, thereby allowing our whole lives to become a symphony of praise and thanksgiving to our God.
