OFFICE FOR MARRIAGE AND FAMILY LIFE

- *Retreats for married couples "Married Love: Two Becoming One"
- *FOCUS helps prepare couples for marriage
- *Natural Family Planning instruction
- *"Teaching the Way of Love" series helps equip parents to discuss issues such as human dignity, sexuality, dating, chastity
- *Baptism preparation men's and women's ministries, separated and divorced ministry.

OFFICE FOR BUILDING AND GROUNDS

The professionals in this office assist parishes and schools with staying in compliance with regulations regarding construction, asbestos, and environmental issues, and guiding remodeling and construction contracts.

LAY EMPLOYMENT RETIREMENT

The Appeal helps support the modest retirement benefits to over 1,700 eligible participants.

OFFICE FOR MINISTRIES AND SOCIAL CONCERNS

This office directs the formation for the permanent diaconate, as well as programs of formation for the laity, including the Lay Formation Institute (over 800 commissioned since 1973) and Leader of Prayer Program (over 300 commissioned since 1989). In addition, this office coordinates pastoral care to the Hispanic community, and it collaborates with the US Bishop programs for national and international relief and development. Catholic Charities, the Diocesan Mission Office, and the diocesan Social Ministry Advisory Committee benefit from the direction of this office.

OFFICE OF SACRED WORSHIP

When attending celebrations at the Cathedral, such as Ordinations, the Chrism Mass, Confirmations, etc. the liturgical guidance from this office is very evident. The staff here alsohelp to deepen our understanding of the Rites and how the manner of the liturgical celebrations impacts our daily lives.
