

OFFICE OF MARRIAGE & FAMILY LIFE

OFFICE FOR BUILDING & GROUNDS

The professionals in this office assist parishes and schools with staying in compliance with regulations regarding construction, asbestos, and environmental issues and guiding remodeling and construction contracts.

LAY EMPLOYEE RETIREMENT

The Appeal helps support the modest retirement benefits given to the over 1,7000 eligible participants.

OFFICE FOR MINISTRIES & SOCIAL CONCERNS

This office directs the formation for the permanent diaconate, as well as programs of formation for the laity, including the Lay Formation Institute (over 800 commissioned since 1973) and Leader of Prayer Program (over 300 commissioned since 1989). In addition, this office coordinates pastoral care to the Hispanic community, and it collaborates with the US Bishop programs for national and international relief and development. Catholic Charities, the Diocesan Mission Office, and the diocesan Social Ministry Advisory Committee benefit from the direction of this office.

OFFICE OF SACRED WORSHIP

When attending celebrations at the Cathedral, such as ordination, the Chrism Mass, Confirmations, etc. the liturgical guidance from this Office is very evident. The professionals here also help to deepen our understanding of the Rites and how the manner of the liturgical celebrations impacts our daily lives.
