Hi All,

Here's another student testimony; she talks about her experience at SEEK but also the impact one of our FOCUS missionaries, Hannah, has had on her life. Hannah and our missionaries are doing great work!

When I started my freshman year, I knew I wanted to pursue my faith and still go to church. At first, I started at a different church; it was rewarding to be able to go and be with friends but I still wanted to try other churches. So, I took a chance and I went to 8:30 P.M. Mass with a friend one Sunday. As soon as Mass ended, Hannah introduced herself to my friend and I while providing a warm cup of hot chocolate. Right away when I came to the church I felt like I belonged. We soon got coffee together and started discussing ways to become more involved in the Catholic faith community. My friend and I had both discussed interest in going to SEEK but she could not go. I was hesitant to go without knowing anyone on the bus. While I was thankful that Hannah had taken the time to listen to my fears about going on the trip, she showed me how exciting it would be with all the different speakers and with BEN RECTOR singing. She replaced the fears with excitement. The whole week was a moving experience for me. As soon as I got on the bus I was welcomed by beautiful smiling people right away, even if they didn't know who I was, while being half asleep at 5 A.M. The Masses that we went to daily were such moving experiences having 17,000 people attending and worshiping along with multiple bishops. I can safely say that was the biggest Mass I've ever been to. Being there in the Mass, I felt truly immersed into something greater. When I got to Adoration later in the week, it was breathtaking to be there in such peace with a room full of people all there to meet Jesus. One strong point that I got from this whole week with the speakers was that we cannot let social media consume our beliefs, nor let it change our beliefs. I was gifted with some exciting news during the week that I would be going on a mission trip to Brazil in the summer with Hannah as well. I am excited to go deeper into my faith journey and share the Catholic Faith. As the trip went on, I was able to gain strong friendships with people in pursuing our Faith. I'm forever grateful for meeting Hannah as she helped introduce me to this Church and has become a strong model of mine.

I can't imagine how frustrating it must be for older folks without computer skills but can reassure you that if you can manage email, you can manage MSP. Never feel badly about calling me (cell: 608-385-8516) or emailing me (mehaupert@viterbo.edu) if you need assistance. I have met some of the loveliest people through these encounters!

I also apologize for not being able to accommodate all your needs last July. I was extremely overwhelmed when the parishes first merged and had all I could do to just generate a schedule. I'm sure that there were several people who stopped serving because they lost their connection with folks who they teamed with for years. I have better work/life balance now that Mary Blaha-DeBoer has assumed music director responsibilities and can more efficiently meet your scheduling needs. For example, if you would like to work with certain people at Mass and/or be scheduled once a month, I can group you into a team and/or make a pre-assignment for the first, second, third, or fourth Sunday of each month. You need only ask.

Finally, I had a teaching/learning session today with Ellen Smith, Administrative Assistant at BSP, to help her gain some skill with MSP. 
SOLES 4 SOULS

- 1. "Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven." The poor include both literally poor people, in need of basic necessities, and figuratively poor people, who are aware of their spiritual poverty, people who acknowledge their need and utter dependence upon God. The reward mentioned here is nothing less than the kingdom of heaven. What do we consider to be our family's greatest riches?
- 2. "Blessed are they who mourn, for they will be comforted."
 Those who mourn could be anyone who is sad or experiencing a loss of any kind. Jesus promises comfort for those who suffer. When we suffer we have a choice to make: we can become bitter, or we can become more compassionate to others in pain. How do we find comfort in our family?
- 3. "Blessed are the meek, for they will inherit the land."

 The meek are people who are humble and patient. A person who chooses other ways to resolve conflicts without resorting to violence is meek. The reward is great wealth. How do we resolve conflict in our families?

4. "Blessed are they who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they will be satisfied."

This blessing is for people who hunger for justice in our world. Children have a great capacity to see wrongs and often possess a simple view of complex issues. Perhaps our kids can use their creativity to solve some of the local injustices in schools and communities.

. "Blessed are the merciful, for they will be shown mercy."

Mercy is a word that holds many meanings: forgiveness, kindness, compassion. It is easier to extend mercy to others when you begin with yourself. In our family, rather than keeping track of mistakes, we try to see God's grace among us. With mercy, you receive back the more you give.

- 6. "Blessed are the clean of heart, for they will see God."
- Who better to be clean or pure of heart then little ones? They lack malice and have such innocence, at least during the first few years. Of course, they see God, because there is nothing clouding their vision! The clean of heart can also be people who single-mindedly see God first in all situations and people.
- 7. "Blessed are the peacemakers, they will be called children of God."
- What risks do we take to make peace? Jesus asks us all to be peacemakers; we are, after all, children of God. As his children, we must continue to work for unity and understanding. Our families are microcosms of the world in which we learn peacemaking skills. Peace begins at home.
- 8. "Blessed are they who are persecuted for the sake of righteousness, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven."
 It can be difficult to do what is right, such as standing up to someone who is acting like a bully. But we learn from Jesus, and, through practice in our family, we see that doing the right thing is what it really means to be a follower of Jesus.
