CHANGE IN MUSIC LEADERSHIP

For the past 24 years, I have been the music director at Roncalli Newman Parish and have had the pleasure of working with Msgr. Pierce, Fr. Alan Wierzba, Fr. James Kurzynski, Fr. Raj, Fr. Billy Dodge, Fr. Mano, Fr. Matt Marshall, and Fr. Sam McCarty...not to mention all the parishioners and music ministers who worked with me in various capacities. When I was first hired in the fall of 1998, my part-time responsibilities balanced my husband's teaching at UW-L. In 2003 I was hired as a full-time member of the music department at Viterbo University, which begged the question of whether I should quit my church job. With Mike's support (and my youngest entering kindergarten) I started working seven days a week.

When the parishes merged this summer, I struggled with how I was going to manage both positions. I scaled back at Viterbo by handing over my role as chair of the department to a younger colleague. It wasn't enough, and discernment morphed into keeping one job over the other and flip-flopping between the church job and teaching. My long-time friend and cantor at Newman, Mary Blaha-DeBoer, knew that I wanted bothmore time with my kids and grandchild in California and the freedom to drive north to see my 93-year-old mother. Her suggestion that we share the job seemed plausible, so on December 1, 2022 I will become the Director of Liturgy and Mary Blaha-DeBoer will be the new Director of Music.

I am hoping to write more about Mary in the coming weeks and will ask her to contribute something about herself, family, and love of church music.

More on Safe Families

Safe Families for Children is a family preservation movement motivated by radical hospitality, disruptive generosity, and intentional compassion to keep children safe and families together. We bring church and community together, mobilizing an army of volunteers to advocate for vulnerable children and socially isolated families. In many situations, parents or guardians may be challenged in providing a safe and caring environment for their children, putting them at risk of abuse and neglect. In the past, extended family or neighbors stepped in to help families by caring for their children. Today, however, many families are socially isolated, and their extended family is nonexistent, or unavailable or unable to help. Adding to the problem is the fact that most state child welfare agencies are required under law to intervene only those children who suffer blatant abuse or neglect, leaving thousands of children at risk. Safe Families for Children keeps families together. Research shows that children who grow up in their own families lead to better outcomes in terms of sense of identity, educational attainment, overall stability, and employment.

October is the month of the Rosary!

Dear Parents.

We are very excited to provide you with an initiative that has been requested over the last several years by, most notably, students as well as parents, Catholic school teachers, priests, directors/coordinators of parish Faith formation programs, youth ministers and catechists. "Going Deeper in Prayer" is the title of this initiative.

The vision:

During the month of October, the focus of prayer is on the Rosary. Will you set aside 10 minutes each day for your family to pray a decade of the Rosary, allowing it to become very personal and a place of encounter with Our Lord for each person who is praying with it?

The role of the family is vital to each child's understanding of the importance of and commitment to a daily habit of prayer. A well-known statement is "The family that prays together, stays together." The goal:

The goal is that children and young people pray in the home with their parents each day to deepen their friendship with Jesus Christ. This time together as a family for prayer is so important as it will become a part of your, and their life, that they will never forget.

"Going Deeper in Prayer" needs to begin and continue in an ongoing manner primarily in the family:

"Family catechesis... precedes, accompanies, and enriches all other forms of catechesis. Parents have the mission of teaching their children to pray" (Catechism of the Catholic Church, paragraph 2226). "Parents are the primary educators in the faith" (General Directory for Catechesis for the Universal Church, n. 225).

"...With their parents leading the way by family prayer, children... will find a readier path to human maturity, salvation and holiness" (The Church in the Modern World – Gaudium et Spes, Second Vatican Ecumenical Council, n. 48).

Parent Resources

Parents are the primary educators of their children in helping their sons and daughters come to know the Person of Jesus Christ through studying the Catholic Faith, daily conversation with Him in prayer and reception of the Sacraments, especially attending Mass every Sunday. Learning about Jesus in an ongoing way, being committed to speaking with and listening to Him on a daily basis and receiving the Sacraments, most especially the Holy Eucharist every Sunday, are needed in order to be strengthened to love God and our neighbor. This is the path to happiness – interior peace and true joy. It is helpful to have a picture or statue of Jesus to remain focused on Him during prayer time.

The Catholic School teacher and catechist are to support you in your role of teaching your children to pray.

The following **Parents and Teacher Resources** are also provided online for use in helping children to go deeper in their understanding of the Mysteries of the Holy Rosary: diolc.org/prayer

- A simple introduction about God's love
- The goals for praying this prayer each day
- The meaning of the words of the prayer
- Learning the Principles
- Activities to help students remember the words
- · Spiritual Comprehension: do they understand
- Encountering God in Prayer
- The Scriptural Foundation of the prayer

The following truths underlie any formation in prayer:

- 1. The Person of Christ desires that you develop a friendship with Him. This relationship is prayer. You are to teach your children about the Person of Jesus, but even more importantly, you need to help them to encounter and develop a friendship with Him by modeling your own personal and communal prayer.
- 2. Every person needs to learn how to pray. "Like a wise teacher Jesus takes hold of us where we are and leads us progressively toward the Father" (Catechism of the Catholic Church, hereafter CCC, paragraph 2607). Jesus teaches you how to pray!
- 3. The Holy Spirit dwells within you and guides you in prayer! "The Holy Spirit is the interior Master of Christian prayer" (CCC 2672). The Holy Spirit helps and guides you to develop a daily habit of prayer. If you ask, He will even give you the desire to pray.

Four Prayer Cards are available, one for each of the Mysteries at diolc.org/prayer.

- Joyful Mysteries the first 12 years of Jesus' life (Advent and Christmas Season: Dec./Jan)
- Luminous Mysteries Jesus' public ministry (summer and fall until Advent; after Christmas Season until Ash Wednesday)
- Sorrowful Mysteries the suffering and death of Jesus on the Cross (Lent)
- Glorious Mysteries the Resurrection of Jesus from the dead to the Crowning of Mary as Queen of Heaven and Earth (Easter and the Easter Season: April and May
