Dear Father Joe: Can You Please Tell Me Why Catholics Pray for the Deceased?

Why pray for the dead? Well, to answer that, we have to step back a bit and look at how it all works in this great love story between God and us. God, who is perfect, desires perfection for us. He hungers for us to "be perfect, as [Our] Father in heaven is perfect." This perfection that He desires for us is a difficult thing. But once we give God permission to do so, He will literally stop at nothing to get us there. The thing is, we've got three enemies working against us in this quest: the world, the flesh and the devil. Let's take a guick look at each.

When we talk about "the world," we're talking about a mind-set, a way of thinking that permeates our culture. It's any message passed along to us that is contrary to the Gospel. Pope St. John Paul II talked about "the culture of death" and that is a perfect example of what we mean by "the world." When we talk about "the flesh," we're not talking about our skin. Our bodies are sacred. Instead, we're talking about that spoiled inner child who lives inside of each of us who wants what he wants when he wants it. It's that part of us that lies and manipulates and is selfish. Finally, when we talk about the devil, we're talking about that fallen angel who works hard to destroy, create chaos and lead us into sin. All three are our enemies.

We pray for our living teammates, our brothers and sisters. We also pray for those who have gone before us and who may now be in the process of perfection.

Now, confronting these enemies are the grace, power and love of Jesus as He works in and through all of His creation. We fight these enemies all our days and this fight, coupled with our sin and the sin around us, leave us with scars and battle damage. Sometimes, the work of holiness is so hard, we even work against God. However, since we gave God permission to make us perfect, He never gives up.

So, what does this have to do with praying for the dead? Well, those of us struggling for perfection through God are all on the same team, wherever we are.

Some are here on earth: we fight, we struggle, we pray, we remain faithful, we never give up! We know this process begins on earth, but our eternal reward is perfection in heaven.

In the same way we pray for our living teammates, our brothers and sisters, we also pray for those who have gone before us and who may now be in the process of perfection. This process is called purgatory, where God's perfect love and grace confront and heal the damage we've done to our souls on earth. Here, God takes His hunger for our perfection up a notch.

There also are the saints in heaven. These are the folks who have finished the process of purgatory and have entered fully into God's glory. The joy that waits there cannot be described.

So, why pray for the dead? Because all three groups—the saints on earth, the saints in purgatory and the saints in heaven—are all on the same team, united by the same God who loves us all. Look at what Paul wrote in Romans:

What will separate us from the love of Christ? Will anguish, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or peril, or the sword? No, in all these things we conquer overwhelmingly through him who loved us. For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor present things, nor future things, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor any other creature will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord. (Rom 8: 35, 37-39)

C.S. Lewis, in "Mere Christianity," uses the image of a child with a toothache who goes to his mom for something to stop the pain. Mom gets him the immediate relief, but also takes him to the dentist, who finds all the problems with all his teeth and gets right to work. Does it hurt? Yes, but it's a healing hurt.

The saints in heaven pray for us on earth and those in purgatory—what a wonderful love that connects us even in and after death!

I leave you with a few words from "Mere Christianity." Go check this book out and enjoy another day in God's presence!

"If we let Him—for we can prevent Him, if we choose—He will make the feeblest and filthiest of us into a god or goddess, a dazzling, radiant, immortal creature, pulsating all through with such energy and joy and wisdom and love as we cannot now imagine, a bright stainless mirror which reflects back to God perfectly (though, of course, on a smaller scale) His own boundless power and delight and goodness. The process will be long and, in parts, very painful; but that is what we are in for. Nothing less. He meant what He said." – C.S. Lewis

EXTRAORDINARY GRACES IN NOVEMBER

What is important about November 1st to the 8th?

The Church offers extraordinary plenary indulgences*, applicable only to the souls in Purgatory, from November 1st to 8th.

Why should we visit a cemetery to pray for the dead?

One of the "extraordinary plenary indulgences involves visiting a cemetery. A partial indulgence is available all year-round, but from November 1 through November 8, this indulgence is plenary. As a plenary indulgence, it remits ALL temporal punishment due to sin, which means that simply by performing the requirements of the indulgence, you can obtain the entrance into Heaven of a soul who is currently suffering in Purgatory.

This indulgence for a visit to a cemetery encourages us to spend even a few moments in prayer for the dead in a location that reminds us that we, too, will someday need the prayers of the other members of the Communion of Saints. For most of us, the indulgence for a cemetery visit takes only a few minutes, and yet it reaps immense spiritual benefit for the Holy Souls in Purgatory.

What exactly must I do?

To obtain the *plenary indulgence* you must do one of the following indulgenced acts and meet the conditions listed below the acts.

Indulgenced acts in November for a *plenary* indulgence, *applicable only* to the Holy Souls in Purgatory:

- November 1 to 8—visit a cemetery and pray for the departed. The following prayer is recommended:
 - Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them. May they rest in peace.
 - (During other times of the year, a *partial* indulgence can be applied to the Poor Souls in Purgatory by this act.)
- 2. November 2, All Souls Day—visit a church or oratory and pray one *Our Father* and one *Creed* for the Poor Souls in Purgatory.

The conditions necessary to gain an indulgence. You must:

- 1. Be a baptized Catholic (cannot be excommunicated).
- 2. Be in the state of grace (free of mortal sin) during the time of the indulgenced prayer or practice.

- 3. Have the general intention of gaining the indulgence and carry out the indulgenced act.
- 4. Be free from all attachment to sin, even venial sin.
- 5. Go to Confession within 20 days before or after the indulgenced act is offered. One sacramental Confession suffices for any *plenary* indulgences done within the 20 days.
- 6. Receive Holy Communion for each *plenary* indulgence sought. Reception may take place on the same day or within 20 days before or after the indulgenced act. (It is certainly better to receive Holy Communion while attending Holy Mass, but for the *plenary* indulgence, only Holy Communion is strictly required.)
- 7. Pray for the intentions of the Supreme Pontiff for each *plenary* indulgence sought. One *Our Father* and one *Hail Mary* fully satisfies this condition. Prayer may take place on the same day or within 20 days before or after the indulgenced act.
- 8. A plenary indulgence can be acquired only once in the course of a day (except at the hour of death another can be gained); a partial indulgence can be acquired multiple times in one day. An indulgence is plenary or partial according to whether it removes all or part of the temporal punishment due to sin. An indulgence is only partial if the work and the three prescribed conditions given in #5, #6, #7 are not fulfilled or, if excluding all attachment to sin is lacking.

With this most generous gift of indulgences by the Church, let us encourage everyone to seek indulgences for the benefit of the Holy Souls in Purgatory! In addition, the Holy Father will receive many needed prayers. Following is a possible prayer to add to your morning:

I wish to share in the Communion of Saints by gaining all the indulgences I can today; and I place them in the hands of our Blessed Lady for the relief of the souls in Purgatory. My Jesus, mercy! Mary help! Amen.

*(An indulgence is the remission before God of the temporal punishment still due for sins forgiven in the Sacrament of Penance. Every sin, whether venial or mortal, incurs a debt or stain of sin, also called temporal punishment. Indulgenced prayers and practices are effective ways of making satisfaction to God's justice for this debt owed for sins. When a soul's debt of temporal punishment for sins is not satisfied here on earth, satisfaction takes place in Purgatory. Indulgenced prayers and practices are listed in the Enchiridion of Indulgences published by the Vatican's Apostolic Penitentiary.)


