# FROM THE DESK OF FR. BILLY DODGE

The third Sunday of Advent is called Gaudete Sunday. "Gaudete" in latin means "rejoice." Can someone really be told to rejoice? The liturgy reminds us that joy is meant to be part of the life of a Christian. Deep joy is not simply equated with an external jovial attitude. Joy comes from a sense of knowing I am loved. We find so much joy in being loved by family and friends. How much more joy is there in being loved by the source of love - the perfect relationship of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit! If we are lacking joy it is a good practice to stop and meditate upon this, to allow myself to rest in God's presence, and allow God to simply love me.

In addition to prayer, the Sacrament of Confession and Reconciliation is an excellent place to experience God's personal love and care for me. I want to remind everyone that Monday, December 18, Cathedral will host the Confess-a-thon from 9:00am - 6:00pm.

Finally, I want to thank the parishioners for supporting the Diocesan Annual Appeal. The DAA not only helps important endeavors in our Diocese, but it also helps our parishes. #### The "O Antiphons" of Advent

For the final days of Advent, December 17 to the 24. there are beautiful "O" Antiphons that are prayed each day before the Gospel. These short "O" Antiphons are traditional titles of Christ: "O Wisdom," "O sacred Lord," "O Root of Jesse's Stem," "O Key of David," "O Radiant Dawn," "O King of all the nations," and "O Emmanuel" which means "God with us." These traditional titles for the Savior connect the coming of Jesus Christ with the prophetic writings of the Old Testament. (See back table or check the online bulletin)



These "O" Antiphons are traditional titles for the Savior that connect the coming of Jesus Christ with the prophetic writings of the Old Testament.

The "O" Antiphons are provided below, followed by a verse of the Advent hymn "O Come, O Come Emmanuel" from which they derive.
