#### **PARISH SURVEYS**

There will be two surveys, one for students and one for stationary members. Both surveys will provide information that will be useful for decision-making. It's important to know that majority preference doesn't determine the outcome. Father Billy will consider all factors impacting any changes made at either BSP or RNP.

**STUDENT SURVEY:** We only had 44 respondents for the student survey, which is due to the many distractions that students have at the end of the semester. We ran last year's survey and received only 22 responses. It is my hope that the priests, FOCUS director John Collins, Campus Minister Maddie Stoffel, and former CM Adele Gligorevic can meet after Memorial Day to discuss the data and options for the future.

**STATIONARY SURVEY:** Tom Schlesinger (RNP parishioner and political scientist who conducted surveys at Gundersen Lutheran) met with Mary Ellen on Friday, May 12th to discuss the stationary member survey. The data we receive will help us recruit liturgical ministers, track parishioner attendance at our various Mass offerings, and develop a list of parishioners interested in social justice outreach, Rosary leadership, bible studies, book studies, and more. # Roncalli Newman Social Justice Committee Jail Ministry Volunteer Opportunity

Jail Ministry needs volunteers to work with youth. There is an opportunity to provide services/studies for the youth once a week, as needed in the Juvenile Detention Center. We are looking for volunteers that would be interested. They would be placed on a weekly rotation list and would need to call the facility first to see if there is a need that week. If there is, they would provide the service/study. Once we have the volunteers, the specific evening and time will be decided. The facility has on average of 4 youth and they do come from around the state. We are hoping the volunteers would have connections to other churches so when they get out, they could find continued fellowship. The ages are 10 to 17 with most of them being 15 to 16.
